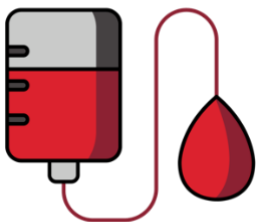
Apply Now for The Student Affairs Student Advisory Board
